The “Gary J. Colberg” Lifetime Achievement Award

The Northern California Collegiate Volleyball League (NCCVL) announces the introduction of The “Gary J. Colberg” Lifetime Achievement Award. This award is dedicated to its first recipient, Gary J. Colberg, for his tireless dedication and insatiable passion for our sport. For without his vision and dedication, collegiate club volleyball programs would surely not be as large or organized as it is today. Gary founded the UC Davis men’s volleyball program in 1967 as an associate athletic director of intramural sports and sports club at UC Davis. He continued on to create and coach the Sacramento State Men’s program in 1980. Founder and former commissioner of the NCCVL, Gary created opportunities for students to compete at collegiate level otherwise not available to them. His philosophy was always to be inclusive, provide opportunities, and to celebrate and recognize the accomplishments of the players and teams. A philosophy the league still holds today. Gary organized the first collegiate club national championships, consisting of only 4 teams. Today, 360 teams participate in 9 different divisions for men and women. Gary’s contribution to sports extend beyond volleyball. At the time of his retirement from UC Davis in 2006, he had built up the intramural program he started to 57 different men’s, women’s, and co-ed intramural team sports that involved more than 15,000 students a year. It is clear the impact Gary has had on countless athletes that has come through his many programs and the impact on the countless athletes that will surely come after. We are honored to celebrate the many great contributions Gary Colberg has made by dedicating his life-work to the endeavors of others.

Over three decades ago while at UC Davis, Gary organized the first collegiate club national championship tournament. That effort inspired expansion of opportunities throughout the country. Today, the NCVF National Championship is the largest intercollegiate volleyball tournament in the world, attracting over 5,000 participants from every region of the USA.

I have had the honor of knowing Gary and his amazing wife Debbie Colberg for many years. Gary is a friend and mentor to me and many others around the country who believe in the promise of opportunity and, who are willing to take steps necessary to make that promise a reality. Gary's unselfish dedication to collegiate club athletes is reflected in the culture that has grown up around our sport – a culture that produces volleyball officials, coaches, administrators and players at all levels of the sport for both men and women. By planting a tiny seed, Gary has helped grow a mighty forest.

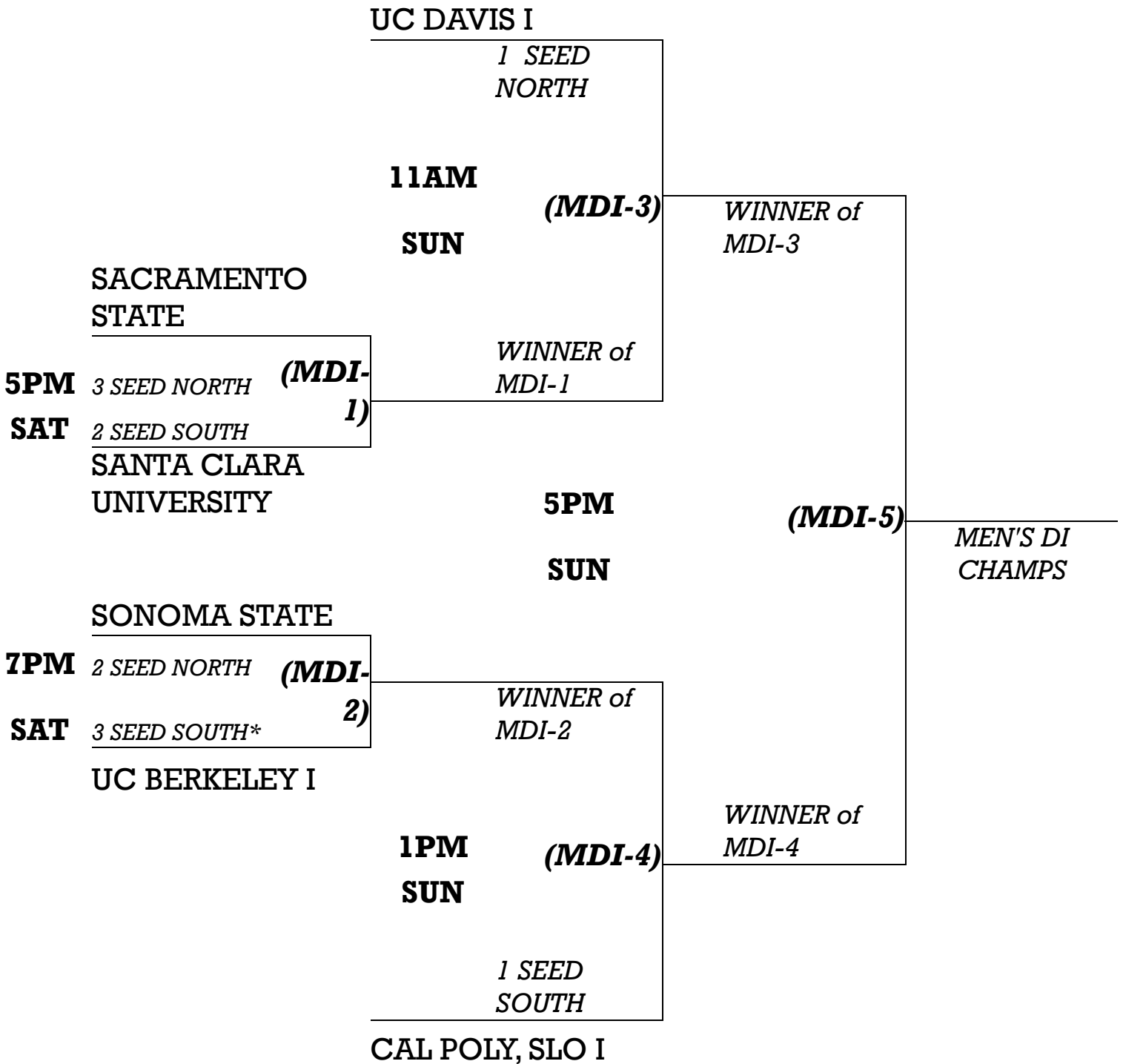
